In fact, it is expected to claim over half of the people over 85 in coming years. Coincidentally, the past twenty years have seen substantial advances in the Neurosciences and allied fields. These major contributions, from the discovery of human stem cells in areas affected by Alzheimer's to the sequencing of the Human Genome, have given rise to new tools, which are ripe for applications to the field of Alzheimer's.
